Executive Director's Message

Welcome to Child Care Algoma's celebratory 40th year in providing licensed child care and early years services to families with young children in Sault Ste. Marie and the Algoma District.

On August 13th, 1982 Child Care Algoma, formerly known as "Sault *Ste. Marie Day Care Services Co-operative Inc." received a Certificate of* Incorporation under The Co-operative Corporations Act. Forty years ago launched the beginning of what today has become a large multi-service Agency which provides dedicated, licensed and exceptional care and early years services to hundreds of children and families throughout Sault Ste. Marie and the District of Algoma.

Having reached this significant milestone, we have an opportunity to reflect on our past, celebrate our achievements and contemplate how our Agency can continue to meet the growing needs of our communities in the days to come. This report will highlight some of the more significant developments of 2022.

As we may recall the previous year was a time of overcoming barriers through the pandemic, while 2022 was focused on pandemic recovery, resilience and building forward momentum. On March 9th, 2022 the Ministry of Education, Early Years and Child Care Division released information that the Province was returning child care programs to a more normal learning environment, while still maintaining protective measures, such as rapid antigen tests, ventilation improvements, screening and continued access to personal protective equipment. The most applauded modification occurred on March 21st, 2022 when masking and staff personal protective equipment was no longer required. We were equally content when cohorting and physical distancing was lifted. Although pleased with these amendments we were most gratified when we were able to welcome parents back into our buildings and programs. I will always be appreciative of our staff, families and Home Child Care Provider's for their relentless efforts, cooperation and stamina during those very challenging times. We continue to prioritize health and safety measures within all our programs.

We recognized that the global pandemic ignited fatigue with many employees; however, despite their weariness children continued to thrive while educators continued to set the foundation for lifelong learning for each and every child. Staff also found the energy to heighten comradery amongst one another by conducting program challenges. They planned fun theme days with a focus on helping others in need. In February 2022 the Dacey Road team initiated the first challenge with plaid shirt day and collected non-perishable items for St. Vincent's Place. They challenged R.M. Moore and that team consequently scheduled "Tacky Tourist Tuesday" and raised \$545. for the Twinkie Foundation. I am pleased to share that the challenges continued throughout the year and that every Child Care Algoma program participated in raising funds and donations for other organizations, such as, the local food bank, Elementary Breakfast Club, Relay for Life, Infant Development Program and the Soup Kitchen. Thank you to all program teams for your ambitious efforts while supporting these worthy causes.

The pandemic emphasis finally began to ease while our attention became more prevalent with the announcement received on March 28th, 2022 when Ontario signed a historic deal with the federal government. Ontario's action plan under the Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care (CWELCC) Agreement outlines key principles and priorities that will lower fees for parents and provide more accessible and high quality child care for families.

In late August Child Care Algoma submitted applications to our respective service system managers to acknowledge our interest in opting into the CWELCC system. In the Fall of 2022, we received notification to confirm approval that our centre based operations met the enrollment qualifications; followed by the approval for Home Child Care a few weeks later. Retroactive fee rebates for eligible children were processed on October 1^{st} , 2022. Fees were reduced again December 31^{st} , 2022, with an additional reduction, to an average of \$10/day that is planned for the end of the fiscal year 2025 – 2026.

Also, in 2022 the workforce crisis continued to be at the forefront. The pandemic exacerbated this longstanding quandary and despite our persistent efforts to recruit Registered Early Childhood Educators; as well as retain our current staff, our attempts fell short. Unfortunately, effective December 16th, 2022 we had to make the difficult decision to close our Queen Elizabeth and East View Extended Day Programs. In our efforts to alleviate any further disruptions to our services we continue to advocate on behalf of Child Care Algoma and the child care sector. We also encouraged parents to reach out to influential political leaders to share their potential concerns. Early Childhood Educators need to be recognized for the essential work they do!

Despite the challenges brought on by the shortage of educators, I must convey my extreme gratitude to the Site Supervisors and Program Coordinators. Daily, they work tirelessly to establish strategies to ensure all programs meet the child/staff ratio. On many occasions they balanced a gamut of different roles to ensure required standards were achieved. Their creative minds and ability to work collaboratively to find solutions is noteworthy. I also need to acknowledge our entire workforce to include educators, EarlyON teams, Cooks, Maintenance and support staff, who have exerted tremendous professional aptitude to ensure our programs continued to be recognized as high quality learning environments. Administrative and finance staff also need to be commended for all the additional work caused by the implementation of CWELLC. In addition, a highly regarded mention to our 2022 Employees of the Year; Jennifer Bougie, Dacey Road Site Supervisor and Erin Hamilton, RECE, Queen Street Site. Thank you for your exemplary work ethics and unwavering dedication to the Agency and your vocation. In recognition of the Home Child Care Providers thank you for your continued determination and enthusiasm for the work you do and special congratulations to Denise Radford, Ederlina Tremblay and Olivia Boissoneau for their achievements this past year. A parent satisfaction survey was completed in the Spring of 2022 and the consensus was summed up by the following parent comment; "We are thoroughly satisfied and couldn't ask for better quality...Thank you for being such a huge part in my child's life – your job is so important".

There is perhaps no greater responsibility or reward than the relationships we develop with the children in our care. It is for this reason I thank the parents for the privilege and opportunity to spend our days in the company of their children. We must also celebrate the children for providing us with perpetual enjoyment. As an organization we recognize the importance of reflection, learning and growing to continuously improve our partnerships, strengthen our connections and achieve the best outcomes for the children and families.

In Appreciation, as always, I would like to express my gratitude for the commitment and talents of our professional Board of Directors. You are each a passionate representative that brings expertise, engagement and thoughtful intuition to the table. On both a professional and personal level I am grateful for the time and dedication that you offer to Child Care Algoma's purpose. A very special thank you to Jennifer Rizzo who will be leaving our Board this year after serving a ten-year term.

I also extend thankfulness to our partners to include the District Sault Ste. Marie Social Service Administration Board, the Algoma District Social Services Administration Board and the Ministry of Education, and to others for joining us for yet another distinctive year.

In closing, I must emphasize the Management team to include Neill Malcolm, Talia Bruno, Suzanne Manson, Diana Taranto, Jennifer Parrella and Kelly Rowlinson. Child Care Algoma is indebted to the work performed by these strong, attentive, competent and loyal ambassadors. Thank you for your ongoing support!

As I sign off on my final report to the employees, families, children, caregivers and partners of this prestigious Agency, I extend my heartfelt gratitude for the opportunity to be a part of this well-regarded mission for the past 35 years of our 40 year celebratory milestone. I wish you success as you continue to write the amazing story of Child Care Algoma.

History

In **1982**, Sault Ste. Marie Day Care Services was incorporated as a Co-operative Corporation. The agency started from a small office on Queen Street with a private home day care office purchasing services from twenty five providers. The agency later opened a small Parent Resource Centre with a toy lending library.

In **1988** Sault Ste. Marie Day Care Services opened it's doors at 148 Dacey Road offering families a child care program, the private home day care office with additional providers and a parent/child resource centre with a toy lending library.

In **1991** we opened the Queen Street Child Care Program. This location also provided for administration support to Private Home Day Care (currently known as Home Child Care).

In **1993** Child Care Services were expanded to meet the needs of the community of Thessalon and surrounding areas.

In 1995 Sault Ste. Marie Day Care Services changed it's name to Child Care Algoma.

In **1997** Child Care Algoma assumed responsibility for the French language licensed Child Care and Family Resource Program; Le Carrousel des Amis.

In 1998 Child Care Algoma opened the Station Mall Family Resource Program.

In 1999 R.M. Moore Child Care program was opened in the R.M. Moore Public School.

In **2001** Child Care Algoma assumed responsibility for the Algoma Co-Operative Children's Services. This program includes the Canada Prenatal Nutrition Program and the Community Action Program for Children.

In **2003** we became the lead Agency for the Best Start Hubs. The official grand opening occurred June 24, 2003 at the Station Mall location. In addition, Satellite programs are located across the community.

In **2008** and in conjunction with the local Best Start Network, Child Care Algoma made a commitment to support the Best Start initiative and offer programming at Holy Angels School, Dacey Road, École Notre-Dame-Du-Sault and Prince Township.

In **2010** Child Care Algoma introduced infant programs at our Queen Street East and Dacey Road locations.

In **2012** we offered programming at the *new* Holy Cross School to include, a Best Start Hub, a Toddler, Preschool and a Before and After School program. This model follows the Province's vision of a seamless system for children from birth to school age.

A Before & After School Program also opened at F.H. Clergue French Immersion School.

In 2014 the Thessalon Child Care Program relocated to the Thessalon Public School.

In **2015** an infant program opened at 115 Shannon Road. We also expanded the preschool playground to include a large play space in a new natural setting.

In 2017 we opened a new Infant, Toddler, Preschool and Extended Day Program at the St. Basil School location.

In **2018** we opened a new Extended Day Program at Grand View School. Dacey Road Child Care Program expanded to accommodate 3 additional infant spaces. Parkland Child Care Program also expanded to offer new infant spaces, additional toddler and preschool spaces. In May we celebrated the "Official Openings" of the following EarlyON Child and Family Centres; St. Basil School Site, Northern Heights School Site and River View School Site. Holy Cross School Site, Holy Angels and École Notre-Dame-Du-Sault School Site were included in the celebrations.

In **2019** we celebrated the official launch of the EarlyON Mobile Hub. The Mobile Hub is the first of its kind in Northern Ontario and this service will allow Child Care Algoma to provide further opportunities for children, parents and caregivers in our community while it also supports the Ministry of Education's vision for an integrated, cohesive system of services and supports.

In **2020**, we re-located from a single classroom at R. M. Moore School to our own newly constructed wing of the school. We expanded this program to include infant and toddler spaces. We also experienced a move within Echo Bay School. We increased spaces to include infant care in a newly renovated program.

In **2021**, we opened a new Infant, Toddler and Preschool program located within the former Rosedale School Site, as well as, a new Infant, Toddler, Preschool and Extended Day Program at the Central Algoma Elementary School. We also opened a new EarlyON Child and Family Centre located within the former Rosedale School.

We have grown to offer a wide range of licensed child care programs to include Infant, Toddler, Preschool and Extended Day Care, as well as EarlyON Child and Family Centres. We employ many staff and remain the largest child care service provider in the District of Algoma.

The EarlyON Experience 2022 Program Highlights



Great beginnings inspire great possibilities. EarlyON Child and Family Centres offer free, drop-in programs for families from birth to 6 years of age. EarlyON centres offer children, parents and caregivers a friendly environment that fosters positive learning with a wide range of quality programs and services to help your child reach their full potential. We provide programs and services for your whole family with opportunities to play, explore, discover and learn in a supportive environment. Programs provide experiences that foster social, emotional growth and development in the early years.

We are so very proud of the skills, knowledge, and expertise of our educators as they continue to play such a critical role in fostering the well-being of young children. Our educators continue to bring new ideas and exciting activities in the EarlyON to keep our children happy, active and engaged, all while respecting safety protocols. We closely are following all directives from our Public Health partners to ensure that health and safety of children, families and staff member remain a top priority.

In response to Covid-19 pandemic the EarlyON Child and Family Centres re-opened in March and during the months of January and February, virtual EarlyON programs and services emerged out of necessity to ensure continued service delivery. They have evolved to become an integral element of EarlyON service delivery in our community.

Virtual EarlyON

Virtual Programming and take home kits were distributed weekly based on the participants attending our virtual learning program. Activity kits were prepared with the items required for the virtual sessions so that families would have all items required to participate along with staff.

Family Meal Kits

Family meal kit pick ups were offered at our EarlyON Holy Angels School Site and EarlyON Rosedale Site on Saturdays. These kits included a meal option as well as child-friendly snack items. Families were able to pre-register by visiting www.keyon.ca.

Lunches for Learning

Bagged lunches were offered at our EarlyON Holy Angels School Site in partnership with the Soup Kitchen. We provided bagged lunches on Mondays and Wednesdays to support families who had children learning virtually or heading back into the classroom.

Family Engagement

When families are engaged, partnerships are created that have a common focus helping children grow and thrive. Relationships with families support overall family well-being and children's healthy development. Play based activity kits were created as a way to support families. Community draws for children and families throughout the month of February included Family Meal Giveaways, Family Fun give-a-ways which included activities that were interactive such as board games. Activities were focused on the importance of families spending time together having fun, forming strong bonds and traditions that are often developed in times of fun, as are great memories. To promote the practice of self-care for parents and caregivers, we gave away self-care baskets focusing on the importance of taking time to do things that help parents and caregivers live well and improve both their physical and mental health. We encouraged the importance of role modeling self-care to children by making it a part of parents/caregivers daily routine. Self-care skills are one of the first ways that children develop the ability to plan and sequence task performance and to organize the necessary materials in order to carry out daily tasks

Reflecting on Black History Month

We shared stories from Black authors, artists and singers and engaged in exploration and questioning about race and difference. We created environments where all children felt a sense of belonging, a sense of pride in their identity and where they seen themselves in the toys, books and artwork that surrounds them. We continue the important work started in February throughout the entire year. Early years programs are uniquely positioned to break down stereotypes and support belonging, well-being, engagement and expression for children, families and educators.

Mobile Services

During the summer and early fall, we coordinated an advertising campaign to promote mobile services with a weekly schedule of locations and activities. We visited various neighbourhoods so that families would have better access to EarlyON Child and Family Centre services as well as further integrate EarlyON programming into the whole community.

Field Trip

Kiwanis motto is "Serving the children of the world" and we were able to support the **Kiwanis Club of SSM and sponsored breakfast for children and families** on Saturday, October 1. Field trips enrich and extend the learning by increasing children's knowledge in a particular subject area and expanding children's awareness of their own community. Service is at the heart of every Kiwanis club and we were able to share this experience with the children and families.

Triple P

We focused on the principles of Triple P and engaging families with the understanding of how Triple P can help from raising happy confident kids, manage misbehaviour, encourage behaviour you like, take care of yourself as a parent/caregiver, feel confident in what you're doing and set realistic rules and expectations. As part of the sessions we incorporated Yoga sessions to support the importance of Principle #5 Taking Care of Yourself.

Engagement is an important part of building strong communities for children and families and to enhance a sense of social connectedness and belonging.

Programs and services have been based on the strengths and needs of our community with a continuous process of adapting, building upon and refining our ability to reach our community, building upon existing strengths and partnerships, reflecting on community leadership, knowledge, and life experiences.

2022 Program Feature

St Basils Child Care Playground

When operations began in 2017 at the St. Basil location, our team saw opportunity to procure an unused large park like area with many mature trees and room to run. After support from the Huron Superior Catholic District School Board to transform the space into a playground for 24 preschoolers, and funding from our local Sault Ste. Marie District Social Services Administration Board we were able to create a space for our children, staff and families to enjoy through all seasons. This space has allowed us to engage the children in growing their own vegetable gardens, pick apples for pie making, tap maple trees in spring to make syrup, celebrate graduation and special holidays with family bon fire nights and SO much more.

We look forward to a lifetime of fresh air and memories made in this beautiful space.

Moving forward in 2022, and with the lifting of many of the COVID restrictions, staff and families were excited to return to in person activities and parenting programs. All measures recommended by Algoma Public Health and the Ministry of Education were implemented to ensure families could participate in person safely. Slowly throughout the year we were able to re-engage our community partners in visiting our programs to connect with families and to offer information and supports to the parents and children. We also developed some new partnerships to offer some new opportunities for families in the communities. Some of the in person programs offered included:

> Drop in play and learn. Kids Can Cook at Home Outdoor nature walks and activities Monthly Parents & Tots Skating (NEW) Baby Picasso & Infant Massage Parenting (Nobody's Perfect, Triple P & Infant Massage) Face Painting & crafts at Community Events

To accommodate families who were not comfortable or could not attend in person, staff continued to offer virtual and remote opportunities such as:

Virtual story times and science opportunities Crockpot Kitchens Family Activity Kits Virtual parenting programs Phone check ins Food and emergencies supply deliveries

Canada Prenatal Nutrition Program

The Canada Prenatal Nutrition Program supports pregnant women in giving their child the best start in life by providing them with access to milk, nutritional food and information on healthy living and eating during and after their pregnancy. The goals of the program are to improve the health of pregnant women, support the healthy development of the fetus, reduce the number of babies born with unhealthy birth weights, promote breastfeeding and mother-baby attachment, and increase the accessibility of services for pregnant women. The CPNP program is offered to pregnant mothers in need living in communities along the North Shore from Echo Bay to Blind River.

The program is funded by the Public Health Agency of Canada and administered in partnership with Algoma Public Health and Algoma Family Services.

In 2022; 21 women and 23 infants were supported. (2 sets of twins)




I would like to express my appreciation to the amazing team of Educators that I work with each day, who continuously display their
