In recognition of the Child Care Algoma's team the following will provide a glimpse of some of the noteworthy achievements that occurred in 2021.

- As a result of the pandemic and school closures we operated a full day Emergency Child Care Kindergarten Program at the St. Basil EarlyON Site from January to June 2021. This program was extended during July and August for a summer program.
- Dedicated to school age children, Thessalon offered a full day Spring Break Program, an Emergency Child Care Program during May and June, 2021, a Summer Care Program in July and August and a program the week prior to Christmas.
- Dedicated to school age children, Central Algoma offered an Emergency Child Care program during May and June 2021, as well as, a summer program throughout July and August, 2021.
- Some Home Child Care Providers also offered emergency child care to their families.
- February 2021: We obtained a license to operate a new program located within the former Rosedale School, Sault Ste. Marie, ON. The Rosedale Child Care Site offers care for infants, toddlers and preschoolers.
- April 2021: We obtained a license to operate a new program located within the Central Algoma Elementary School, Desbarats, ON. The Central Algoma Child Care Site offers care for infants, toddlers, preschoolers and an extended day program for kindergarten children.
- July 2022: We opened a new EarlyON Child and Family Centre located within the former Rosedale School, Sault Ste. Marie, ON.
- ♦ We developed and implemented recurrent regulations, policies and procedures associated with the
- pandemic and ensured environments, children and families were protected.

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- Due to the pandemic EarlyON Child and Family Centres (main and outreach sites) and Community Action Program for Children were closed for in-person visits for approximately 5 months of 2021. While closed and to ensure support to children and families staff offered virtual ZOOM and Facebook live programming.
 - We focused on employee recruitment to assist with the "community" wide shortages of Early Childhood Educators.
- We achieved clear license renewals.
- We continued to support the Agency's affiliated Home Child Care Program, Providers and their premises.

Special thanks and gratitude to Program Coordinators, Suzanne Manson, Diana Taranto, Jennifer Parrella, Kelly Rowlinson and to Talia Bruno, Manager of Programs and Human Resources and Neill Malcolm, Manager of Finance and Information Systems. There really are no words to adequately convey my appreciation for your ongoing support and first-class devotion to this organization.

While also contemplating upon positivity during these last several months, I must make mention of the spiritedness of the children that grace us with their presence each day. Unbeknown to these little youngsters, their mere existence creates an ambience of contentment, tranquility, and optimism. We are fortunate to work in a profession where we can experience the innocence, enthusiasm and honesty of children.

In addition, I would also like to recognize all our parents and families. A heartfelt, sincere thank you for believing in Child Care Algoma and depending on us to care for your children, particularly during the uncertainties brought on by the enduring pandemic. Your trust in our programs and in our Educators has been instrumental to our success.

History

In **1982**, Sault Ste. Marie Day Care Services was incorporated as a Co-operative Corporation. The agency started from a small office on Queen Street with a private home day care office purchasing services from twenty five providers. The agency later opened a small Parent Resource Centre with a toy lending library.

In **1988** Sault Ste. Marie Day Care Services opened it's doors at 148 Dacey Road offering families a child care program, the private home day care office with additional providers and a parent/child resource centre with a toy lending library.

In **1991** we opened the Queen Street Child Care Program. This location also provided for administration support to Private Home Day Care (currently known as Home Child Care).

In 1993 Child Care Services were expanded to meet the needs of the community of Thessalon and surrounding areas.

In 1995 Sault Ste. Marie Day Care Services changed it's name to Child Care Algoma.

In **1997** Child Care Algoma assumed responsibility for the French language licensed Child Care and Family Resource Program; Le Carrousel des Amis.

In 1998 Child Care Algoma opened the Station Mall Family Resource Program.

In **1999** R.M. Moore Child Care program was opened in the R.M. Moore Public School.

In **2001** Child Care Algoma assumed responsibility for the Algoma Co-Operative Children's Services. This program includes the Canada Prenatal Nutrition Program and the Community Action Program for Children.

In **2003** we became the lead Agency for the Best Start Hubs. The official grand opening occurred June 24, 2003 at the Station Mall location. In addition, Satellite programs are located across the community.



R.M. Moore Child Care Program

In **2008** and in conjunction with the local Best Start Network, Child Care Algoma made a commitment to support the Best Start initiative and offer programming at Holy Angels School, Dacey Road, École Notre-Dame-Du-Sault and Prince Township.

In 2010 Child Care Algoma introduced infant programs at our Queen Street East and Dacey Road locations.

In **2012** we offered programming at the *new* Holy Cross School to include, a Best Start Hub, a Toddler, Preschool and a Before and After School program. This model follows the Province's vision of a seamless system for children from birth to school age. A Before & After School Program also opened at F.H. Clergue French Immersion School.

In 2014 the Thessalon Child Care Program relocated to the Thessalon Public School.

In **2015** an infant program opened at 115 Shannon Road. We also expanded the preschool playground to include a large play space in a new natural setting.

In 2017 we opened a new Infant, Toddler, Preschool and Extended Day Program at the St. Basil School location.

In **2018** we opened a new Extended Day Program at Grand View School. Dacey Road Child Care Program expanded to accommodate 3 additional infant spaces. Parkland Child Care Program also expanded to offer new infant spaces, additional toddler and preschool spaces. In May we celebrated the "Official Openings" of the following EarlyON Child and Family Centres; St. Basil School Site, Northern Heights School Site and River View School Site. Holy Cross School Site, Holy Angels and École Notre-Dame-Du-Sault School Site were included in the celebrations.

In **2019** we opened a new Extended Day Program at Queen Elizabeth School. In September we celebrated the official launch of the EarlyON Mobile Hub. The Mobile Hub is the first of its kind in Northern Ontario and this service will allow Child Care Algoma to provide further opportunities for children, parents and caregivers in our community while it also supports the Ministry of Education's vision for an integrated, cohesive system of services and supports.

In **2020**, we re-located from a single classroom at R. M. Moore School to our own newly constructed wing of the school. We expanded this program to include infant and toddler spaces. We also experienced a move within Echo Bay School. We increased spaces to include infant care in a newly renovated program.

In **2021**, we opened a new Infant, Toddler and Preschool program located within the former Rosedale School Site, as well as, a new Infant, Toddler, Preschool and Extended Day Program at the Central Algoma Elementary School. We also opened a new EarlyON Child and Family Centre located within the former Rosedale School.

We have grown to offer a wide range of licensed child care programs to include Infant, Toddler, Preschool and Extended Day Care, as well as EarlyON Child and Family Centres. We employ many staff and remain the largest child care service provider in the District of Algoma.

Infant Programs

Infants in child care have the extra advantage of being in an early social environment with their peers. Parents are confident that our educators offer a safe, loving, compassionate and stimulating environment that builds confidence, curiosity and communication skills. Infants are born ready to learn. Infant programs are currently offered at our Dacey Road, Shannon Road, St Basil, Parkland, R.M. Moore, Rosedale, Echo Bay, Central Algoma and Thessalon Child Care locations.

Toddler Programs

Our caring Registered Early Childhood Educators develop meaningful relationships with our families. Toddlers need regular routines that encourage safe exploration and play. Our child care programs provide a nurturing environment that supports a child's social, emotional, physical, creative and cognitive development in a holistic way.



Queen Street Program

Preschool Programs

Child Care Algoma's preschool programs provide caring environments that enhance all levels of a child's development. Our knowledgeable educators plan curriculum that supports early learning practice which is based on the belief that all children are individual and unique learners. We offer experiences to engage children in active, creative, and meaningful exploration, play and inquiry. Each of our Child Care Programs offer similar services, however have unique characteristics reflective of the location and the dynamics of the families they serve.

Extended Day Programs

These programs for children aged 4 to 12 years foster individual and group collaboration. The children develop and learn in a fun environment that provides a wide variety of age appropriate activities. Extended day programs provide families with peace of mind that their children are in a safe and secure program before and after the school day.

The EarlyON Experience

2021 Program Highlights

EarlyON programs are available for families pre-conception, prenatally, and beyond. We know that children need much more than just immediate families to grow up strong. Our programs and services provide your whole family with opportunities to play, explore, discover and learn in a supportive environment, free of cost.

In response to COVID-19 pandemic the EarlyON Child and Family Centres were closed January, February, April, May and June in 2021.

It's important to acknowledge how the ongoing social and emotional ramifications of the pandemic have affected our children and ourselves. We are so very proud of the skills, knowledge, and expertise of our educators as they continue to play such a critical role in fostering the well-being of young children. Our educators continue to bring new ideas and exciting activities in the EarlyON to keep our children happy, active and engaged, all while respecting safety protocols. We closely are following all directives from our Public Health partners to ensure that health and safety of children, families and staff member remain a top priority.

Virtual EarlyON

Virtual EarlyON programs and services emerged out of necessity to ensure continued service delivery during the COVID-19 pandemic and the resulting closure periods. They have evolved to become an integral element of EarlyON service delivery in our community that will likely continue throughout the course of the pandemic and beyond. **Interactive Virtual Zoom sessions were offered and we had 536** Adults and 753 Children participate.

Family Meal Kits

During our program closure, we were able to reach out to families through weekly meal kit pick ups. **Through this program we served 215 Adults, 265 Children.**

We supported **22 adults and 28 children through our Thanksgiving Meal Kits** which included Turkey, Stuffing, Potatoes and Carrots.

Bagged Lunches in Partnership with the Soup Kitchen

During the virtual and hybrid learning sessions, we distributed **100 bagged lunches per week to the children throughout our community**.

Take Home Activity Kits

Play based activity kits were created as a way to support families. We wanted to encourage families that we are in this together. We were able to offer Take Home Activity Kits to 567 children throughout the year.

Our Growth ~ OPENING CELEBRATION

Our new **EarlyON Child and Family Centre Rosedale Site** opened its door in July offering access to quality programs to many more children in our community.

Community Hub Activity Kits & Food Distribution

Activity and Meal Kit deliveries were completed for the Chapple/Albion area for the March break and the summer months.

This included 96 activity kits and 53 meal kits

EarlyON Weekend Programming

In September, we welcomed families to our Saturday openings at our Holy Angels, Rosedale and Holy Cross locations.

Mobile Services

During the summer and early fall, we visited various neighbourhoods so that families would have better access to EarlyON Child and Family Centre services as well as further integrate EarlyON programming into the whole community.

Community Christmas for Children

We celebrated the 31st season of Community Christmas for Children which ran from December 1, 2021 to January 2, 2022. This year, **48 in person activities** were offered in **addition to some virtual options** for families to participate in.

Learning Earning and Parenting Program

Family Kits were created and distributed quarterly to the parents completing the Learning Earning and Parenting Program. These included 25 each of March Break, Summer Safety & Fun, Holiday & Winter Fun Family Activity kits. **Through this program, we distributed a total of 75 family kits throughout the year.**

Triple P

This year Certified Practitioners in the **Triple P Positive Parenting Program** began offering the **Triple P Online** program where parents could access modules based on their schedules and have contact with a Triple P Practitioner for support.

A total of 93 Adults participated in various Triple P programs.

2021 Program Features

Rosedale Child Care

In February of 2021 the Rosedale Child Care Program welcomed it's first family.

This beautiful new site is licensed for infant, toddler and preschool aged children.

Although 2021 continued to fill us with many challenges, it also offered so many amazing learning experiences, new friendships and opportunities.

With this new site we are thrilled to able to provide quality care to many more families in our community.



Central Algoma Child Care

On April 26, 2021 after many delays due to construction issues and COVID, the Central Algoma Child Care Program opened its doors to children and families. The Centre is licensed for 10 infants, 15 toddlers, 24 preschoolers and 30 school age children. With our own entrance and school age space the Centre has become the home for our Community Action Program for Children/EarlyON Child and Family Centre for the Desbarats area. Though parents, due to visitor restrictions, were unable to enter our space for pre enrolment tours or to personally connect with staff, we are grateful to the families who



entrusted us with the care of their children.

We must also acknowledge the energy and determination of the Central Algoma Child Care educators, who provided families with regular documentation that allowed them to have visual understanding of their child's daily learning experiences and to feel a sense of belonging with in our child care community. Also within the short time we have been open, it has been exciting to see the wonderful partnership that has developed between the child care program and the Central Algoma Elementary School (CAES). We are looking forward to hosting, in the near future, an open house for our families and the community to invite them inside to see first hand our learning environments.

Echo Bay Infant Child Care Program

2021 was another challenging year for the CAPC/EarlyON programs due to the many necessary restrictions and community lockdowns that were in place. Our dedicated team continued to be innovative in responding to the needs of families and communities. With in person programming being limited they

continued to stay connected with families through regular check ins by phone, contactless drop off of supplies and kits for family engagement. Virtual programming which included interactive parent-child activities, as well as some parenting programs were offered by staff and in partnership with other community agencies.

Programs offered included:

- Kids Can Cook at Home
 - Crockpot Kitchens
 - Family Activity Kits
- Outdoor nature walks and activities
- Virtual Parenting (Nobody's Perfect, Triple P & Infant Massage)
 - Virtual story times and science opportunities

We delivered door to door cooking and activity kits to

- Over 90 families
- Provided over 800 family meals
- Provided 125- 150 families support through monthly connections
- Again space to store and package food items was donated by the township of MacDonald, Meredith and Aberdeen Additional



Canada Prenatal Nutrition Program Central Algoma / North Shore

The Canada Prenatal Nutrition Program supports pregnant women in giving their child the best start in life by providing them with access to milk, nutritional food and information on healthy living and eating during and after their pregnancy. The goals of the program are to improve the health of pregnant women, support the healthy development of the fetus, reduce the number of

babies born with unhealthy birth weights, promote breastfeeding and motherbaby attachment, and increase the accessibility of services for pregnant women. The CPNP program is offered to pregnant mothers in need living in communities along the North Shore from Echo Bay to Blind River.

The program is funded by the Public Health Agency of Canada and administered in partnership with Algoma Public Health and Algoma Family Services.

In 2021, 21 women and 23 infants were supported. (2 sets of twins)



Health and Safety

Child Care Algoma held its Health and Safety week May 30th to June 5th, 2021. We included educational resources on WHMIS and on Slip, Trip and Falls as



this is the most commonly reported incident in our agency. The social was held on zoom due to Covid-19 restrictions. We played a game with WHMIS labels where staff needed to find a household item that contained the hazard symbol. Our silly sign war winners were Queen/Shannon, R.M. Moore and Holy Cross and the Monthly Hazard Free draw winner for 2020 was the Community Action Program for Children (CAPC).






Professional Learning Practice



Supported by funding provided by the Algoma District Services Administration Board, staff of the licensed child care and EarlyON programs, were encouraged to pursue and attend individual professional development sessions on line that would support their continuous professional learning and program goals.
